

Clover Bud / Pee Wee Guidelines

Age Groups:

Notes:

Clover Bud / Pee Wee Still Exhibits should be kept simple. Each year that a child is enrolled, they should try to do a different project than the year before. This is to show new skills learned, as well as showing advancement in 4-H.

- For the Cass County Fair, exhibitors in this division are allowed to take 2 Still Exhibits to display at the fair.
- Exhibitors will meet face-to-face with a judge to show them their exhibit and talk to them regarding their process.
 - This judging is non-competitive.
 - Exhibitors will receive a participation ribbon.
 - Exhibitors are not allowed to sell any of their exhibits in the Youth Still Exhibit Auction

Suggested Project Areas:

- Vegetables – may take one item that they planted, cared for at home.
- Scarecrows – a smaller version of the recommended 4-H size
- Flowers – one specimen, small house plant or outside plant
- Flower Arrangement – a very simple one with maybe three flowers
- Food – no-bake cookies or very simple baked cookie
- Candy – the “no cook” kind, dropped only
- Sewing – very simple, place mat, towel, sample with sewn on buttons
- Knitting – very simple, one piece
- Crocheting – very simple using chain stitch or single crochet stitch, one piece
- Personalization – tie-dye with cold dye, simple sponge border
- Cross Stitch, Embroidery, Crewel, Pretty Punch, Plastic Canvas, Etc. – one small item
- Candle Making – one candle using bees wax only, NO cooked waxes
- Macrame – simple knotted bracelet or single line item
