Apply to be a Counselor for Summer 4-H Camp!

Do you enjoy both the "great outdoors" and working with younger 4-H members? Then 4-H has a great opportunity for you! Summer 4-H Camp is set for **June 10-12**, **2024**, and we're looking for qualified 4-H teens to serve as **Camp Counselors**!

Following are the qualifications for serving as a 4-H camp counselor:

- Must be a currently enrolled Cass County 4-H member.
- ♦ Must be 15-19 years old by January 1, 2024.
- Prior experience working with youth 8-12 years of age desired, but not required.
- Must be available to attend training on Saturday, April 13 and Sunday, April 14 at Amigo Centre in Sturgis. If there is a conflict, please note that on your application.
- ♦ Must be available to work full time at Summer 4-H Camp. This includes participation in camp <u>set-up</u> starting at 2:00 p.m. on <u>Sunday, June 9</u> and continuing through the release of campers at 4:00 p.m. on Wednesday, June 12.

Note: Summer 4-H Camp officially starts on Monday, June 10 at 9:00 a.m. with registration of campers.

Summer 4-H Camp:

Cass County 4-H Program will be partnering with St. Joseph & Branch Counties 4-H Programs to provide an overnight Summer 4-H Camp experience for youth ages 8-12. In order for youth in our county to participate in the camp our county needs to provide teen counselors. The number of counselors selected will impact the number of youth we will be able to have participate in the camp. Scholarships will be available for counselors and partial scholarships will be available to campers. More information, including registration will be available in April.

YQCA Certification:

All youth exhibiting swine at the Cass County Fair must complete the YQCA Certification.

Youth aged 7 must complete the certification through an instructor led class. Youth aged 8-18 may choose to complete the certification through an instructor led class or online. Exhibitors older than 18 must complete the course online.



Registration is open for 4-H Great Lakes and Natural Resource Camp!

4-H Great Lakes and Natural Resources Camp is an annual three-time national award-winning camp that mixes summer fun and hands-on science education. The camp will be held July 28 - August 3 on the shores of Lake Esau at Camp Chickagami in Presque Isle. This pre-college program is for teens who will be age 13 to 15 during camp.

Campers will increase their science literacy and stewardship as they learn from natural resource experts in fields such as Great Lakes coastal and fisheries management, limnology, wildlife, forestry, geography, geology and environmental education. In addition to hands-on learning, attendees will also enjoy exciting natural resources recreation activities such as kayaking, snorkeling, sailing, fossil hunting, archery, photography and evenings around a campfire. First-time campers also go charter fishing and learn to fillet their catch.



Registration is now open! The registration fee is \$500 and includes six nights of lodging, all meals and snacks, a t-shirt and program and activity costs. 4-H Exploration Days is Michigan 4-H's largest pre-college program and could be the highlight of your summer—maybe even change your life! This exciting event is open to any Michigan youth ages 12 –19 as of Jan. 1.

4-H Exploration Days, scheduled for June 19-21, is designed to help youth build the skills they need to successfully transition to college and to life as an adult. Michigan 4-H youth who participate have the opportunity to stay in MSU campus residence halls while attending classroom and field trip sessions.

With more than 100 session choices held on and off campus, there are topics for everyone including animal science, business and entrepreneurship, international language and culture, performing and visual arts, and science, engineering, and technology. As youth gain important life skills like decision making, problem solving and communication, they'll also have time for fun with free time activities such as skating, basketball and a dance.
